Regulations

Adopted on 14th November 1989

THE ATTENTION OF INTENDING EXHIBITORS IS SPECIALLY CALLED TO THE REGULATIONS

1. The objective of the Society will be the advancement of the agricultural capabilities in the District, the Encouragement of the breeding of cattle, sheep, horses and other livestock, and the improvement breeds.
2. All classes are open unless specified.
3. The whole stock competing must be bona fide, the property of competitors (except in the case of dog and Gymkhana classes. If required, certificates to satisfy the judges of age and qualification of stock must be Produced.
4. The ear numbers of prize-winning animals in bred classes will be inspected by stewards and recorded.
5. **The age of stock is to be calculated from the first day of January of the year of produce.**
6. No cattle from a stock where any contagious diseases have existed within the last six months shall be allowed to enter the show ground or to compete.
7. Premium lists can be obtained from the secretary on application. Any 'doctoring' of stock will immediately Disqualify the animal from being awarded a prize, and the owner of such will be prohibited fro entering stock At any of the Society's' future shows.
8. The show will be held in a field within the show district and will begin at 9am.
9. All cattle and horses must be led and kept in hand. Bulls over 6 months must have a lead ring. **Dogs must be Kept on leads and must not be left unattended.**
10. All stock exhibited must remain in the showground until after the parade, or such later hour as may be fixed by the committee.
11. All protests must be in writing and must be lodged with the secretary not later than the conclusion of the Judging of the classes to which they refer. Protests must be accompanied by a deposit of £10 which will Be forfeited in the event of the protest not being upheld.
12. The Society will not be held liable for any loss, accident or damage that may occur to any person attending The show, or to his or her property, whether as a visitor, exhibitor, competitor or otherwise.
13. Anyone found infringing the regulations will be expelled from the show and will forfeit prizes that may be Awarded to them. Claims for repayment of entry money will not be possible.
14. Anyone using insulting language to a judge, member of the committee or official of the Society or otherwise misconducting him/herself at the show, will, at the discretion of the committee be liable to forfeit of the prizes Awarded to him/her and be expelled from the showground.
15. The prize money will be paid by the treasurer on the day between the hours of 1pm and 4pm. Should any Animal which wins a prize be disqualified, the prize will go to the next in order of merit.
16. All prize-winning animals are required to take part in the parade. Failure to do so may result in the forfeit of Prize money.

In addition to the above

17. **All animals must be accompanied by the correct movement certificates which will be signed by the Secretary on show day. In addition MUST be correctly tagged to meet current department requirements.**
18. **Accredited sheep certificates must be checked by the secretary before unloading in the specified area.**
19. **All cattle and sheep must be vaccinated for blue tongue.**

ALL TROPHIES ARE PERPETUAL, UNLESS OTHERWISE STATED, THEY REMAIN THE PROPERTY OF THE SOCIETY AND SHOULD BE RETURNED BEFORE THE FOLLOWING YEARS' SHOW
